

Artists in Residence

A grant from the Annenberg Foundation allowed us to support the park's Artists-in-Residence program. Artists work with youth from downtown Los Angeles and help them use nature as an inspiration for their creativity and self-expression. This is just one of the education programs in the mountains supported by the Fund's contribution of \$127,717 in 2014/15.

Backbone Trail

This trail flows 67 miles across the spine of the Santa Monica Mountains with stunning city, ocean and mountain views. The Fund was delighted to be given a grant of \$50,000 from REI to invest in improvements to the trail including re-building, re-alignment and plant restoration. We were one of only ten non-profits nationwide to be selected for this program!

Cocoons

These cocoons are not for butterflies! Rather, this innovative new technology will nurture newly planted trees along the Santa Monica Mountains' Backbone Trail. The Fund bought 1200 Cocoons and supported a scientific trial to assess their efficacy in a Mediterranean Climate.
